Our Ofsted report has been released and shared with parents; we are very pleased with the good judgements in all areas. But, more importantly it is the paragraphs about what it is like to attend this school that I am very pleased with. The accolades for our students in these opening paragraphs I am enormously proud of, they describe our school and our children in exactly the way we want the school to be; "proud", having confidence and self-belief, and "learning well and producing work that is high quality". "Ixworth is a happy school, where pupils know they are safe and cared for".

The report states that we have made significant improvements in a short time across the school, we now need to build on these and push to the next level. While an inspection is a stressful time, it is also an opportunity to look in depth and discuss the school with an inspection team that sees many other schools across the country. This now provides us with an opportunity to look for areas to improve. The leadership team and faculty leaders have begun discussing and planning around the areas we need to focus on, including the two specific areas identified in the report.

I have received an email from a parent, and we are proud to highlight the following:

"Freya Bethwaite (Yr 8) and Leila Haywood (Yr 7) swam 3,000 meters on 2nd May (over 120 lengths) with their friend to raise money for a family whose father is terminally ill with cancer. The girl's helped to raise over £1,500"

This is an awesome feat that has raised a significant amount of money, well done to both pupils!

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Science

On Thursday 15th, a group of 26 students from Year 10 took part in the RAF Vigilant workshop led by Sergeant Stu Mulligan, who is a Cyberspace Communications Specialist and serving member of the RAF. Deadline approaches to apply for Suffolk County Council (SCC) funded transport

The deadline to opt-in for SCC funded school travel for the 2025/26 school term is fast approaching.

If your child is eligible for SCC funded school travel **you will need to opt-in by 31 May 2025** to receive travel for the start of the 2025/2026 school year.

If your child already receives SCC funded school travel you still need to opt-in every year.

If your child is starting primary or secondary school in September 2025 and they are eligible for SCC funded school travel, you will have received an email with details of how to opt-in.
