Headteacher

We are fast approaching two key points in the academic year, Year 11 Public Examinations beginning on 8th May, and the final resignation point for staff.

Our Year 11s have been working hard, early indications are that we will easily go beyond last year's results, there are some brilliant results so far with students reaching and surpassing aspirational target grades at all levels. There have been a very high percentage of the key Grades 4 and 5 and above in Maths and English, and some Grade 9s across all subjects. These are predictions based on a range of measures, including mock exams, coursework and on the expectation that students will be working and supported in school right up to the exam day.

In terms of resignations, our staff generally move on for career progression, teachers can only tender resignations at three points in the year, this is part of their Statutory Pay and Conditions. It creates a "log jam" in recruitment as a school cannot recruit until a teacher officially resigns, and inevitably all the schools are recruiting at the same time, in a small school like Ixworth it has a greater impact. However, in terms of resignations we are much better positioned than in previous years, we held interviews this week for staff positions in September from an excellent field of candidates, and appointed to the Head of Computer Science, Head of Science and an additional part time Science Teacher.

After the holidays we will welcome Miss Allard as a permanent Art and Photography teacher and Mrs Wheeler will become full time in Maths. Mrs Harniess will also return to the science faculty, but later in the half term.

We are currently working on our budget for 2025/26. The funding arrangement with the DfE did penalize the school in previous years, but as our student numbers have become higher, and more stable our budget has improved next year. In the current economic climate our budget is still tight, but we are working with our Trust to ensure we capitalise on our improved budget, but plan sensibly for the future.

I wish you all an enjoyable break and look forward to welcoming our students back on Tuesday 22nd April.

Uniform

The turnout of our students is admired by the many visitors we have at our school. Thank you to all parents that support this aspect of the school and creating a sense of belonging amongst our students. We have tried to be pragmatic in allowing a mix of old and new school uniform and using non-branded items as part of our uniform. Just a reminder that canvas or part canvas trainers are not permitted as part of our uniform, they must be all black and "polishable".

Our uniform policy is widely shared and explained on a daily basis to students in our meet and greet at the door, our students are fully aware of what is, and what is not acceptable uniform.

PE kit consists of PE shirt (white polo or new black polo), black shorts or skort or skirt & PE trainers.

Additional items such as school hoodie / leggings are optional extra if they are cold. Leggings should not be worn without shorts/skort/skirt/tracksuit bottoms over the top.

We would also strongly advise students brining football/rugby boots to lessons in case they are on the field during wet weather lessons.
