

Every 1% of attendance lost is roughly **2 days of school** missed.

Current Attendance


Current whole school attendance = 91.5%

Why is attendance important?

Every day really does count

- Attending school regularly helps students keep up with learning, build confidence, and avoid gaps that are hard to catch up later.

Attendance links directly to achievement

- Students with 95%+ attendance are far more likely to achieve strong GCSE outcomes. Missing just 10 days a year (around 95%) can make it harder to secure good grades.

Small absences add up quickly:

- 90% attendance = half a day missed every week
- 85% attendance = almost one full day missed every week

This means key learning is lost, even if absences seem occasional.

Good attendance supports wellbeing and friendships

- Being in school helps students feel part of the community, maintain friendships, and develop routines that support positive mental health.

Attendance affects future opportunities

- Research shows that students who are persistently absent are less likely to stay in education, training, or employment after school.

There is a real financial impact

- Studies suggest that pupils with poor attendance can earn around £35,000 less over their lifetime compared to those with good attendance.

Employers notice attendance habits

- Good attendance builds punctuality, reliability, and responsibility — qualities that employers value highly.

We understand challenges happen

- Illness and genuine difficulties occur, and support is always available. The school works with families to remove barriers and help students attend whenever possible.

Attendance is a shared responsibility

- When students, families, and schools work together, attendance improves — and so do outcomes.

Decoding the 'attendance jargon'



'Ambitious' attendance = 100% = no absence over the whole year

'Excellent' attendance = 98% = 4 days absence over the whole year

'Good' attendance = 95% = 9 days absence over the whole year
