Who we are

My name is Mrs Scott and I am the Attendance and Admissions Officer at Ixworth High School. I have worked at Ixworth since September 2023. Before joining the school, I worked as a Medic in the Royal Air Force, which helped shape my strong focus on care, wellbeing and supporting others.



5 minutes late every day = over 16 hours of learning lost a year. That's nearly 3 days of school missed!

Current Attendance


Current whole school attendance = 91.4%

Why is attendance important?

- At KS4, pupils with 95% - 100% attendance are **1.9x more likely to achieve a grade 5 in English and Maths** when compared to students with 90%-95%. (2 more weeks in school across the year)
- 10 days of absence in year 11 can reduce the likelihood of achieving grade 5 in English and Maths by 50%
- Persistently absent pupils in secondary school could earn up to **£10,000 less at the age of 28**
- For each day of absence between Year 7 to 11, the typical pupil could **miss out on average £750** in future lifetime earnings.

Decoding the ‘attendance jargon’

What does “persistently absent” mean?



A student is classed as *persistently absent*, or PA, if their attendance falls below 90% over the school year. All absences count towards this figure, including authorised absences such as illness or appointments. When attendance reaches this level, it becomes a concern and often means that targeted support and interventions are needed to help address any barriers to attendance. We will work closely with families to provide the right support and ensure every child can fully access their education.
