Happy New Year to you all, and welcome back to our students and staff.

Some lovely words in the press this month about our school by Peter Prinsely MP who visited Ixworth in December; "I spent an enormously enjoyable morning with the students at Ixworth High School", "Ixworth is a wonderful school, and their students are engaging and bright".

Sadly, Miss Avlianios, our Cover Supervisor, moved onto a new school in the holidays as a promotion. We had recruited for the position, but our preferred candidate is unable to take on the role. Therefore, we are advertising again. If you are aware of anyone that might be looking for a new role, please direct them to our website.

We have received the draft Trust report from their visit in December to look at progress. The team consisted of the Deputy CEO (an Ofsted Inspector), the Director of Inclusion, and two headteachers from other secondary schools in the Trust. There were attendance and safeguarding audits in preparation for the visit in previous weeks. I am pleased to say that the number of strengths identified at Ixworth now far outweighs the areas for development. Some positives from the report were:

"Pupils across the school report feeling safe and well supported by staff"

"Pupils overwhelmingly feel the school has improved and that academic support has increased"

"There is a clear focus on raising ambition"

"Pupils with SEN say their lives are being transformed by the relationships they build in the school"

They recognised the progress with raising ambition and the further improvements in teaching since our Ofsted inspection. The areas they identified as requiring development are in line with our school development plan including around feedback and assessment, and personal development.

Whilst it is always pleasant to have the strengths of our school recognised; especially where the staff are working hard to improve an area, we do not consider Ixworth to be the finished article and will continue to strive for improvements in every area of the school.

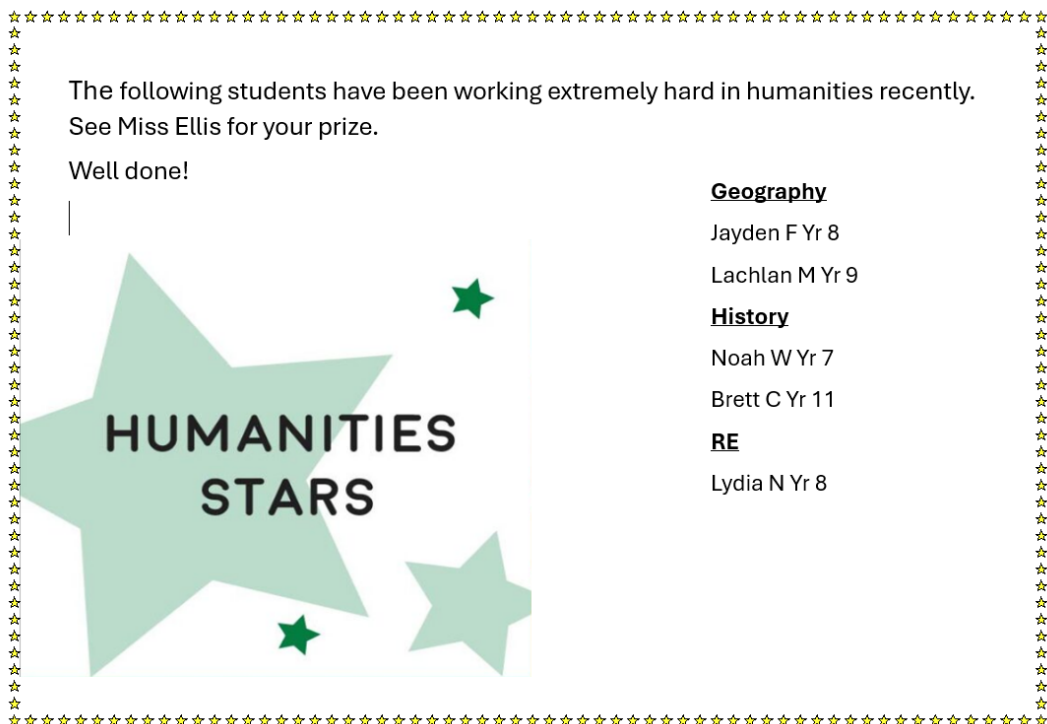

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## Subject Spotlight- Computer Science

### Why is your subject important in this key stage?

Computing equips students with essential skills for the digital age—problem-solving, logical thinking, and creativity. It helps them understand how technology works and how to use it safely and responsibly

### Any teaching methods/strategies that would help people understand how teaching is taking place (implementation of curriculum)?

We use interactive lessons, combining practical programming tasks, group problem-solving, and real-world scenarios. Students learn through coding projects, digital investigations, and discussions about technology's impact on society.

### What are students covering in the Key stage/course? Any overarching themes, skills, concepts that are trying to be achieved.

This term, KS3 students are exploring:

- Programming basics using Scratch and Python.
- Algorithms and logical reasoning.
- Cybersecurity and staying safe online.
- How computers represent data (binary and images).

### Any competitions/House comps/ Homework you are running/have run and their results or aims.

We're taking part in the Bebras Computational Thinking Challenge this term—an international competition that tests problem-solving skills. House points and certificates for top performers!

Ixworth Fire Station plays a vital role in protecting our local community. At present, our appliance availability is being impacted by low crewing levels, which is why we are actively seeking people who live or work locally and may be interested in serving their community alongside their main job or family commitments.
