create an Instagram account. For everyone 13-17 years old (in the UK), their account will automatically be set as private when they join Threads. As with Instagram, users can choose specific words to filter out of replies as well as hide comments that may be offensive. Users can also unfollow, block and report a profile. Any accounts that you have blocked on Instagram will automatically be blocked on Threads as well. Users can also change their settings on Threads so other users are unable to mention them in replies.

Threads is still being developed so new functions will be added but currently you are unable to direct (private) message other users. You need to be aware that your child may come across content that is not appropriate for your child. If your child us using this app, then make sure they know how to use the reporting/blocking facilities, that appropriate privacy/safety settings are applied and they know to speak to a trusted adult should

they need to.
